

Elementary Dress Code Policy Agreement

The dress code shall apply to all students during school hours and school-sponsored activities held in or out of the school building. Depending on the nature of a field trip or activity, the dress policy will be determined by the teacher and/or principal. Students deemed "out of dress code" will be asked to wear a provided article of clothing or asked to receive appropriate clothing from home. See the handbook for the complete list.

Please read the guidelines with your student, sign this form, and return it to the front office.

9.3.2.1 General Guidelines

- 1. For physical education classes, students must wear non-marking tennis shoes. Students will not be allowed to participate without the appropriate shoes.
- 2. Hair should be neatly styled and out of the eyes.
- 3. Extreme hairstyles or unnatural colors are not allowed.
- 4. Shoes must be worn at all times. A shoe with a heel strap is required. (Crocs must be worn in this fashion)
- 5. Jeans and pants should come up over the hips to avoid riding too low when playing or sitting.

9.3.2.2 Unacceptable Apparel for both genders (This is not an all-inclusive list, as items may be added during the school year)

- 1. saggy or excessively tight clothing, including leggings and bike shorts
- 2. visible underwear
- 3. sunglasses, hats, or hoodies (with the hood up) inside the building
- 4. boys should not have any piercings or earrings, and earrings are permissible for girls only.
- 5. inappropriate words or pictures on clothes
- 6. low-cut, sheer shirts or dresses; crop or halter tops, spaghetti straps, large arm openings, no midriff or midlower back showing
- 7. Shorts and skirts must entirely extend beyond the fingertips with arms straight down. Flowy skirts and shorts must reach within a credit card's width of the knee.
